Enforcement Notice Hearing 18-0206

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IIROC to Hold Settlement Hearing for BMO Investment Advisor and Branch Manager Steven Henry Brophy

November 9, 2018 (Toronto, Ontario) – A hearing has been scheduled before a Hearing Panel of the Investment Industry Regulatory Organization of Canada (IIROC) to consider whether the panel should accept a Settlement Agreement entered into between IIROC staff and Steven Henry Brophy.

The agreement concerns allegations that Mr. Brophy failed to adequately supervise a former employee.

The hearing is not open to the public, but will become open in the event that the panel accepts the agreement. If the agreement is accepted, the Panel's decision and the Settlement Agreement will be made available at www.iiroc.ca.

IIROC formally initiated the investigation into Mr. Brophy's conduct in April 2016. The conduct occurred while he was an Investment Advisor and Branch Manager with a Toronto branch of BMO Nesbitt Burns Inc., an IIROC-regulated firm. Mr. Brophy is still employed with BMO Nesbitt Burns Inc.
