IIROC to Sanction Former Vancouver Investment Advisor Richard Shaw Newbury

February 21, 2019 (Vancouver, BC) – The Investment Industry Regulatory Organization of Canada (IIROC) has scheduled a hearing to consider whether a Settlement Agreement entered into between IIROC staff and Richard Shaw Newbury should be accepted.

The agreement concerns allegations that Mr. Newbury made unsuitable recommendations for a client and used his own discretion to execute transactions in that client's account.

The hearing is not open to the public, but will become open in the event that the Hearing Panel accepts the agreement. If the agreement is accepted, the panel's decision and the Settlement Agreement will be made available at www.iiroc.ca.

Hearing Date: March 8, 2019 at 2:00 p.m.

Location: Reportex Agencies, 1010 – 925 W. Georgia Street, Vancouver, BC.

IIROC formally initiated the investigation into Mr. Newbury's conduct in August 2016. The conduct occurred while he was a Registered Representative with the Vancouver branch of Haywood Securities Inc., an IIROC-regulated firm. Mr. Newbury resigned from Haywood effective December 31, 2018. He is no longer registered with an IIROC-regulated firm.
