Carmen Crépin is Vice-President, Québec at the Investment Industry Regulatory Organization of Canada (IIROC).

Prior to joining the Investment Dealers Association of Canada (IDA) in November 2002 as Vice-President, Québec, Carmen had been Chair of the Commission des valeurs mobilières du Québec (CVMQ) since July 1999. She has been a member of the Canadian Securities Administrators (CSA), Chair of the Council of Securities Regulators of the Americas (COSRA), Chair of the Institut francophone de régulation financière (IFREFI), and member of both the executive and technical committees of the International Organization of Securities Commissions (IOSCO). Before joining the CVMQ, Carmen was Vice-President and Secretary of the Fonds de solidarité des travailleurs du Québec (FTQ).

For nearly a decade, from 1989 to 1998, she served as Vice-President and Secretary of the Caisse de dépôt et placement du Québec, where she was responsible for developing and enforcing various corporate policies, among them, the Caisse's corporate governance policies and Code of Ethical Conduct.

From 1985 to 1989, she was Assistant Chief Coroner and Deputy Chief Coroner, with responsibility for implementing a new legislative framework and organizing public hearings.

Carmen is a lawyer and member of the Barreau du Québec. She also holds a certificate in Applied Ethics from the University of Sherbrooke.
