## **IIROC to Hold Settlement Hearing for Defunct Octagon Capital Corporation's Former CFO Christopher John Everest**

**April 30, 2019 (Toronto, Ontario)** – The Investment Industry Regulatory Organization of Canada (IIROC) has scheduled a hearing to consider whether a Settlement Agreement entered into between IIROC staff and Christopher John Everest should be accepted.

The Agreement concerns an allegation that the former Chief Financial Officer of the now defunct Octagon Capital Corporation failed to ensure the Risk Adjusted Capital and financial circumstances of the company were accurately reported.

The hearing is not open to the public, but will become open in the event that the panel accepts the agreement. If the agreement is accepted, the Panel's decision and the Settlement Agreement will be made available at [www.iiroc.ca](http://www.iiroc.ca).

**Location:** IIROC – 121 King Street West, Suite 2000, Toronto, Ontario

IIROC formally initiated the investigation into Mr. Everest's conduct in February 2016. The conduct occurred while he was a Registered Representative with the Toronto branch of Octagon Capital Corporation. As of 2015, Octagon Capital Corporation is no longer an IIROC-regulated firm. The Mr. Everest is not currently a registrant with an IIROC-regulated firm.
